My dear Mary,

The time passes so swiftly that more time has elapsed than I intended since I wrote you last.

I have been very busy in fact much overworked in getting moved and settled for the winter. We gave up possessions of our Longport house the 10th of December. Most of the furniture was sent to Hightstown. Your uncles Jimmie and Elmer have room in their big houses for any quantity of things. Our smaller house is rented until the first of May. I hope to move back there at that time. This house is much cosier than the other and will not be such a problem to keep in order. We have six large rooms, two glasses enclosed sun porches, and a bath. The basement is finished with a concrete floor and has store rooms, fruit closet, tool closets, etc. The house has a hot water heating plant, stationary laundry tubs and full electrical equipment for lights, cooking, and ironing. I am sure we shall be quite comfortable.

I am boarding for the present and enjoying a good rest.

Your grandmother spent two months with me last fall, but has spent the rest of winter at her home in Hightstown. Your Aunt Georgine wrote me that she had spent ten days with them recently.

I am going to spend the weekend at Toms River.

Are the children all right now? I don't suppose they remember me very well now. I hope Howard is still doing well at school and that you are planning to send Verla as soon as possible. Let them get all the education they can for you can never tell how young they may have to stop. Remember me to all.
